

Andrzej Halicki was born on November 26th, 1961 in Warsaw. He graduated from the Department of Internal Trade of the Warsaw School of Economics with an expertise in the field of air transportation. In the course of his studies, between 1988 - 1989, he was a member of the national authorities of the underground, anti-communist organisation NZS (the Independent Students Association) and a leader of the organization at the Warsaw School of Economics.

After graduating in 1990-92, he served as a spokesman and member of the national board of

The Liberal Democratic Congress, inter alia, during the times of the Prime Minister Jan Krzysztof Bielecki. During the first term of Polish Sejm (the lower chamber of the parliament), he was a spokesman of the Parliamentary Club of The Liberal Democratic Congress.

In the early 1990's, Mr. Halicki was the head of the division of public affairs, then Director of the Polish branch of American agency Burson-Marsteller. He was a founder of GGK Public Relations Agency acting under the international agency of Lowe GGK, which belonged to the world's largest advertising network IPG. He left the company after being elected a member of the Polish parliament in 2007.

Since the very creation in 2001, he has been a member of The Civic Platform Party and he had been re-elected to the Polish Parliament up until he won a seat in the European Parliament in 2019. Mr. Halicki served as the Chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee in the lower chamber of the Polish parliament and Head of the Constitutional Accountability Committee. In 2009-2010, he served as a spokesperson for the Parliamentary Club of The Civic Platform. He has been the Chairman of the regional structures of the Civic Platform Party in Mazovia Region of Poland since May 2010 and he has remained at this position up until 2021. From that very year, he has been a member of the national authorities of the Civic Platform Party.

Andrzej Halicki served as the Minister of Administration and Digitalization in 2014 - 2015. In addition to his role in parliament and the government, he was as Head of the Polish delegation to the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (2012-2019), becoming a Vice-President of the Assembly from 2012 to 2014. In 2015, President Nicolae Timofti awarded him Order of Honour of the Republic of Moldova.

Andrzej Halicki is well known in Poland for his passion for animals, traveling, scuba diving and sports, in particular football and basketball, which he practices regularly. He is also a long-time football fan. Together with his wife and son, they breed Great Danes, which are important members of the Halicki family.
